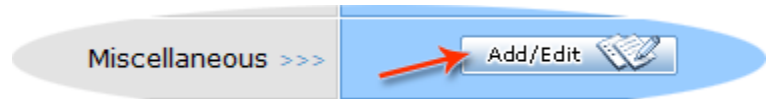


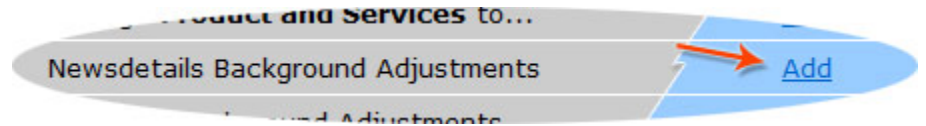
Customising the Colours of your News-Item Popup Windows

The news item popup windows are set to the default colours of the e-c toolset; blue / grey. You may like to alter these colours to match your website – an easy task.


First go to the main e-c menu and click the "Add/Edit" button to the right of the **Miscellaneous** header...



On the next page to the right of the **Newsdetails Background Adjustments** header click the link: "Add" (or "Edit" if returning to make further adjustments)...



You will now get a popup appearing with fields to fill relating to various areas in you "News-item Popup"...

Arrows from the configuration window point to corresponding elements in the preview: a blue arrow points from the Fill Colour field to the popup's background, a dark blue arrow points from the Border Colour field to the popup's border, an orange arrow points from the Logo Colour field to the popup's logo, and a white arrow points from the Logo Path field to the popup's logo image.

These fields are:

- **Fill Colour**
The "colour" you enter into this field will fill the background of the area that displays your news-item's **Header** and **Teaser**. A band of this colour is also displayed as the **footer** of the news-item.
- **Border Colour**
The "colour" you enter into this field will fill the background of the area that displays the **Close** and **Print** buttons, and also the **line that divides the news-item Header and Teaser**.
- **Logo Colour**
The "colour" you enter into this field will fill the background of the area that displays your **Logo** (if you decide to display a logo, as noted next).
- **Logo Path**
Into this field enter the path to the image you would like to have displayed at the top of your News Popup. Upload the image prior to entering the path here by using the Image Upload function found in the Page Editor – you will not have to add this image to that page, just add it to your image library.

The path you enter into the field will look similar to this...

Just replace the text in blue with your own site and file names.

- **CSS URL**
For those of you who know how to code Cascading Style Sheets, you can enter the path to your news-item css document here.
Currently there are only 2 specific classes available for altering...
"**newnewsheader**" and "**newnewsteaser**" both of these are styled tags surrounding the news-item text.

newnewsheader surrounds the *header* text.

newnewsteaser surrounds the *teaser* text and the *main news content* text.

After you have filled in the fields you wish to be altered, click the **Edit** button to save your changes.

The effect is immediate, it is not necessary to publish any of your pages.
Any news-item link now clicked on your site will now display the new colours/image.
